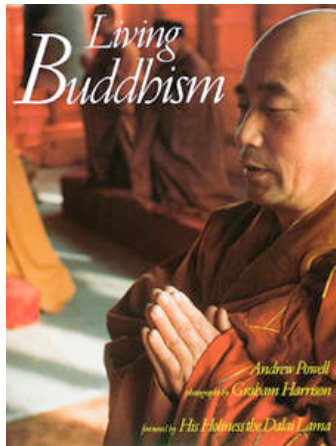


Living Buddhism in Retrospect and Prospect

Living Buddhism was an illustrated book and accompanying exhibition at the British Museum in 1989. The photographs are the work of the renowned photographer [Graham Harrison](#), who journeyed around Asia three times between 1983 and 1987. The collection has now been transferred to Edinburgh and the forthcoming exhibition and related events are a celebration of the revival of this important resource and the starting point of

a long-term project which seeks to maintain and develop the original venture. This exhibition also includes recent work by Ian Astley (Asian Studies) from Japan, China and Korea.
